Incident 61 14/02/17

Loxley Road, Wellesbourne

Between approximately 1630 13/02/17 and 0730 14/02/17 a wire fence was cut to access a compound; vehicle batteries stolen from 2 lorries and 50 litres of diesel stolen from a lorry
